Carr to be Awarded Dr. Thomas Fleck Award for Excellence in Youth Coaching Education

During his time as director of coaching, Carr achieved his USSF "B" License and he went on to coach at the collegiate level while also coaching youth soccer at both the competitive and recreational levels.

Currently, Carr is the associate professor and coordinator of physical education and coaching education for the School of Recreation and Sport Sciences in the College of Health and Human Services at Ohio University in Athens, Ohio.

In 1995, he became a national staff coach for U.S. Soccer, where he provided service as a coaching educator for the National Youth License course that he co-authored with Dr. Thomas Fleck and Dr. Ron Quinn, 2007 Dr. Thomas Fleck Award winner. US Youth Soccer continues to teach the National Youth License throughout the United States. Carr has taught over 25 courses since 1995.

Carr, along with Dr. Thomas Fleck, Dr. Ron Quinn, William Buren and Virgil Stringfield, wrote The Official US Youth Soccer Coaching Manual in 2002. In 2006, the manual was updated. Carr also co-authored Soccer – Mastering the Basic, Personalized Sport Instruction Series in 2000.

Carr also influenced the development and coaching of US Youth Soccer members by co-authoring the youth soccer coaching modules for the Under-6, Under-8, Under-10 and Under-12 age groups.

As a frequent speaker at the annual US Youth Soccer adidas Workshop, Carr has made over 25 presentations since 1996 at national workshops and also at US Youth Soccer State Associations' Workshops.
